### Professor Kevin P. Clements

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*Kevin is the Professor of Peace and Conflict Studies at the University of Otago, New Zealand. He was formerly Professor of Peace and Conflict Studies and Foundation Director of the Australian Centre for Peace and Conflict Studies (ACPACS) at the University of Queensland. He is also Secretary General of International Peace Research Association from January 2009. He has served as Secretary General of International Alert, in London England. He was a member of the NZ Government Defense Committee of Enquiry in 1985 which explored how New Zealand could defend itself without nuclear weapons. Kevin was the inaugural President of the European Peace Building Liaison Organization in Brussels and a Board Member of the European Centre for Conflict Prevention. He Edited the Australian and New Zealand Journal of Sociology in the late 1970s and is currently on the Editorial Boards of Peace Review and Global Change, Peace and Security. He has been an advisor on defense, security and conflict issues to a range of governmental and non-governmental organizations in Australasia, the United States and Europe and Chairman, Facilitator and keynote speaker at many international Peace and Conflict Resolution conferences over the past 20 years. Kevin has been a professor to numerous universities all over the world and he has written or edited 6 books and over 150 chapters/articles*
